This card will give names and contact details for all players taking part. The supervisor will be informed if any team has not done this and he will then ensure that he has the necessary information before the team is allowed to play.</p> <p>All teams will be provided with the necessary information from the FA’s detailed Covid 19 Guidance on restarting Football Activity and will be expected to take all necessary action regarding self assessment prior to attending games.</p>

No teams will be allowed to enter the pitch or surrounding area until instructed to do so by the supervisor or the referee. No spectators will be permitted.
